I reflect and am not sad, because I saw myself when I saw him.

About 13 years ago, we got a chance to really connect and he would come to the house to "watch" me and my younger brother. It was interesting - I was determined to not be "watched", coming into my own and home from college here and there. He did a great job of giving me my space, but we definitely would butt heads - he let me know in small ways that he wouldn't let me slack off. He was stern when he had to be, and we got on each other's nerves. But most of time, he was interesting. I learned he was a renaissance man - we connected over acting, poetry, and cooking (he would invent dishes and I'd often be pleasantly surprised, sometimes I didn't know what he put in it but it tasted great... he might be the only person that likes frank and beans more than me).

His gift of storytelling, like all of my uncles, was legendary... he really had a story about everything and it made me wonder how he had managed to live enough for 3 lifetimes. How can anybody live up to that? Eventually, when he got over me jumping out the window to go see a girl at 3am (oh yes, he caught me and caught me bad) - he told me a story about that, and we laughed, and laughed.

His laugh is probably one of the best laughs I've ever heard. Y'all know what I'm talking about - it was goofy and infectious. We laughed so much when we had a chance to.

The only thing I'm sad about is not being able to hear more about this legendary life. Even in my 30s, I need this guidance, I crave it. And we only went fishing ONCE. We always talked about it - I can't say I imagined doing life without this giant of a personality.

I know my Uncle wasn't perfect. But I do remember every time he would bounce back and be even better, get more involved in church, and spread joy even harder. Anybody can learn something from that.

I'll forever cherish Uncle Tommy's zest for life... I channel all my uncles in my every day life, for many things.

I couldn't escape his memory anyway, because I got the "Tommy Head" (as my mom often reminds me).
